

From August 9th-12th I was grateful to accompany Fr. Peter as a delegate to the 100 Year Celebratory SOBOR of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada which took place in Saskatoon, SK.

This was not a traditional SOBOR in the sense that there was very little business to address, and celebration our Church really was the focus of each day.

From the moment I arrived at the opening reception (where I met up with Father Peter, who had separate clergy sessions to attend prior to the official start of the conference, and Ron and Elaine Rusnak who also came as delegates for our district), the energy was light and positive and welcoming.

I had been excited to attend on a personal level also because I had been commissioned to design the 'branding' for this particular celebration—which included a main logo design as well as pins, awards, banners, web headings, among other variations of. I have to admit that I was thrilled to find that the logo was EVERYWHERE. The SOBOR planning committee did a fabulous job of utilizing the brand in every way possible. And I was truly touched by the positive response I received throughout the entire weekend.

Each day began with a stunning hierarchical Divine Liturgy served by a rotating number of our hierarchs and clergy—rotating because of the sheer number in attendance... It would have been impossible to have everyone behind the Royal Doors! Also rotating was the choir for each Liturgy, and we were treated to the best which included the local Lastiwka Choir, the Ukrainian Male Chorus of Edmonton, and for the final Liturgy, a spectacular joint choir consisting of members of all the choirs, plus any laity wishing to squeeze in.





In the afternoons we were treated to a blend of history and fun: A bus tour of 100 year old rural churches in the area, candle making and community acts of kindness for the youth, a riverboat cruise, symposium, Ukrainian Museum of Canada tour and on Saturday night everyone gathered for a magnificent banquet where we heard words of congratulations from numerous dignitaries and were treated to the talents from the likes of world renowned jazz pianist John Stetch, the Pavlychenko Folklorique dance ensemble, violinist Carissa Klopoushak, opera singer Kateryna Khartova, the above mentioned choirs among others! It was 11:30pm before the program ended, but no one seemed to mind.

Over the course of the weekend, his Eminence Metropolitan Yurji also presented the St. Andrew Centenary Award to those individuals who had been nominated and selected based on contributions to the UOCC and community. I was incredibly honoured to be recognized and receive one myself during the banquet.

There's more I could say, but it's hard to capture it all in one page. I thank the All Saints parish for sending me as their delegate to this once in a lifetime celebration.

















The Prayer Corner

Welcome to **The Prayer Corner** - a place where, over the next few months, we will explore prayer in our Orthodox Faith. Our goal is to learn and grow together as we delve more deeply into the many facets of prayer. In the June Newsletter, we discussed a very basic question, "What is Prayer?" This month, we will start to look

at ways in which our Orthodox faith teaches us to pray.

The Rule of Prayer

In our busy lives, it is so easy to get distracted: work, family commitments, volunteering, getting caught up in social media...texting, posting, viewing, and the list goes on. In the busyness of life, then....when do we have time to pray?

Just as our Divine Liturgy has a "structure," where some parts of the liturgy stay the same, so can our personal prayer life benefit from having structure. Ancient Christians used to pray three times a day: upon waking in the morning; while going about tasks in the middle of the day; and before bed at night. This structure of having **a regular time for prayer** is called the "rule of prayer". So, if we ask the question, "how do we pray?" The first answer should be "consistently…every day!"

During Sunday Liturgy, when the Cherubic Hymn is sung, we repeat the words, "now lay aside all earthly cares". The Church teaches us to set aside our earthly cares, be still, be silent. It is only in silence that we will hear the voice of God in our hearts. The second question is, "how can we do this??" The second answer is, "start small and build!"

Let's start.....set aside the iphone; set aside the morning news, set aside the busy schedule, pick a quiet spot, and for 10 minutes every day spend time with God. If we truly want know God, we must devote space and time to Him. The beauty is, the more we pray, the less it will feel like a struggle or obligation and the more prayer will become a source of strength and joy in our lives.

In the next editions of the District Newsletter, we will look at many more ways our Orthodox faith teaches us to pray and draw nearer to God.
